Under the bridge

Preposition: under

Object of the Preposition: the bridge

"The river flows under the bridge." In this example, "under" is the preposition, and "the bridge" is the object of the preposition.

In the morning

Preposition: in

Object of the Preposition: the morning

"The sun rises brightly in the morning." In this example, "in" is the preposition, and "the morning" is the object of the preposition.

With my friends

Preposition: with

Object of the Preposition: my friends

"I enjoy playing with my friends" In this example, "with" is the preposition, and "my friends" is the object of the preposition.
