

## SAT Central Ideas Simplifying the question prompt

You are given SAT-style English reading passages and multiple-choice questions from an attached PDF. For each passage and its answer options, complete the following three tasks using clear, simple output with no extra commentary, formatting, or explanations.

Task 1: Assign difficulty levels

- Give each sentence in the passage a difficulty score from 1 to 10.
- Give each answer option (a, b, c, d) a difficulty score from 1 to 10.
- Use this key:
  - 1 = A1 / IELTS 1–2
  - 2 = A2 / IELTS 2–3
  - 3 = A2+ / IELTS 3–4
  - 4 = B1 / IELTS 4–5
  - 5 = B1+ / IELTS 5–6
  - 6 = B2 / IELTS 6–7
  - 7 = B2+ / IELTS 7–8
  - 8 = C1 / IELTS 8–9
  - 9 = C1+ / IELTS 9
  - 10 = C2 / IELTS 9

Task 2: Rewrite at Level 2

- Rewrite the passage at level 2 (A2 / IELTS 2–3).
- Use simpler vocabulary, shorter sentences, and clearer structure.
- Keep the central idea exactly the same.
- You may shorten the text.
- Rewrite the question and all answer options at the same level.
- Do not change the correct answer.

Task 3: Rewrite at Level 3

- Rewrite the passage at level 3 (A2+ / IELTS 3–4).
- Slightly more advanced than level 2, but still simplified.
- Keep meaning, structure, and correct answer the same.

Output Tasks 2 and 3 exactly like this format:
